Anchor Points

Encourage Experimentation

it's about direction, not perfection. confidence grows through trying, adjusting, and discovering.



Peer Learning

everyone brings a path. knowledge isn't given, it's navigated together.



Normalizing **Mistakes**

mistakes are messages in disguise. they arrive unplanned but right on time, carrying meaning from somewhere uncertain.



When learners engage in playful low-stakes environments that **encourage** experimentation, risk-tolerance, and playful exploration, they build confidence and deepen their learning through iteration and discovery.

We gently and respectfully, create (safe) spaces where every participant's knowledge, expertise and lived experiences are welcome. We know that we learn best from each other, through peer learning.

"From my experience students enjoy using Menti and Padlet! Menti is very good for pre and post class check-ins! And engaging quizzes as well! Padlet is great for class introductions!" - Rajul

We celebrate mistakes as learning opportunities. An antidote to the perfectionism culture: by normalising mistakes, we create safe spaces where curiosity outweighs certainty, mistakes invite reflection and diverse perspectives spark collective discovery.

When webinar facilitators Maria and Garrett realized that breakout rooms were not feasible in a session, they were agile and adapted to a plenary style session instead. This prompted faculty to respond with:
