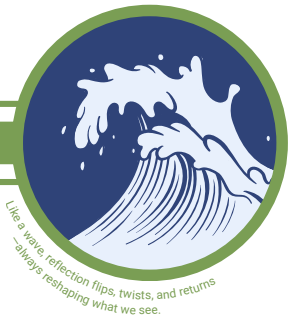

## What are anchor points?

- *"How are we naming and challenging assumptions in business education?"*

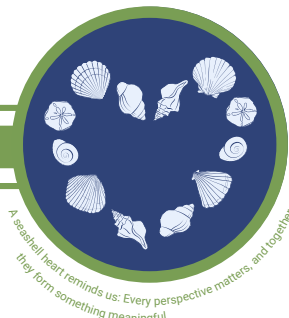


A surfboard turns play into motion—games, tools, and collaboration

## Game on: Play, engage, & explore

Bring playfulness and interactivity into your teaching. Use games, collaborative exercises, and tech tools like Miro or the Wheel of Names to make learning dynamic and experiential.

- *"I liked the assumption wheel as an activity starter, and could use this in classes :)"*
- *"Miro! I've known the tool before, but it is the first time I experienced it as 'a student' and quite enjoyed it."*
- *"Bring in new experiential student activities in my course design and offerings."*

## Together we learn: Collaborate & connect

Build community, foster dialogue, and embrace diverse viewpoints. Open, collaborative spaces encourage richer discussions, empathy, and deeper engagement.

- *"The community aspect of learning."*
- *"Be more open to the views of people with different backgrounds."*
- *"Laughing helps learning."*

## Surf it: Tips for bringing this to life in your classroom

- Challenge assumptions! Kick off sessions with a curiosity-sparking mini exercise.
- Play with tools! Use Miro, sli.do, Padlet, Excalidraw, or other tools to shake up routines.
- Mix it up! Add games, debates, or brainstorming bursts to make learning memorable.
- Share & explore! Encourage small-group discussions to surface diverse perspectives.
