Driving Global Impact: Fara Azmat's PRME Champion Journey

Motivated by a deep passion for sustainability and social inclusion, Professor Fara Azmat saw an opportunity to embed the Principles of PRME and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) across the Deakin Business School. Under her leadership, Deakin became a PRME Champion for the first time, a recognition reserved for Signatories that demonstrate exceptional commitment to integrating responsible management into their teaching, research, and operations, while providing models for others to follow.

"You don't have to convince anyone here about the importance of sustainability because they're already committed. It's a safe space for sharing and peer learning," Fara shared while reflecting on her participation in the network. As the PRME Champions prepares for a new cohort, Fara shares the impact she intends to build on, including integrating the SDGs more systematically across curriculum and research, progressing from Bronze to Silver Carbon Literacy accreditation, and expanding student engagement through initiatives like the newly formed Student Sustainability Group.

The PRME Secretariat was delighted to participate in the 12th RMER Conference, co-organized by Faculty of Organizational Sciences (FON), University of Belgrade and PRME Anti-Poverty Working Group. The Conference was held under the theme Rethinking Growth and Exploring New Possibilities for a Regenerative World, enabling a vivid discussion on unexplored management research and education areas that reconnect purpose to responsible business and leadership.

The conference brought together management educators and practitioners from 38 countries, featuring 127 approved submissions across 24 tracks and a series of inspiring keynotes and panels on regenerative solutions, leadership, and responsible management education.
