3. COVID-19 Pandemic: Impact and strategies

Sometime in the second week of March 2020, Dayananda Sagar Institutions temporarily closed as a measure to contain the spread of the novel coronavirus. As the days passed by with no immediate solution to stop the outbreak of Covid-19, there was indeed a short-term impact on the continuity of imparting education. The structure of learning, including teaching and assessment methodologies, was the first to be affected.

The larger concern, however, on everybody's mind was the effect of the pandemic on the conduct of the affiliated Bangalore University final year examination and further- employment of the recent graduates fearing withdrawal of job offers from corporates because of the then prevailing situation.

However, the institution navigated the challenges and grappled with the situation of educating students online while mitigating the spread of the coronavirus. Moving away from traditional pedagogies and going digital were the keys to the situation.

3.1 Initiatives taken by the institution

Migrating to digital ways: Technology emerged as a lifeline for the academic world stymied by the pandemic. Within a matter of weeks, teachers imparted pedagogical instruction on digital platforms. Many of them went a step further to create customized virtual lessons to fill in specific gaps in students' learning caused by the unexpected hiatus in the academic year.

Time Relaxations: The institution stepped forward to help students by permitting deferment in paying the college fees giving a temporary breather to the parents till their financial situation improved. Deadlines were also extended to provide ample time for students to take cognizance of the situation and complete assignment and projects.

Online mentoring: During the lockdown period, special emphasis was on regular online mentoring and guidance of students.

Stepped up and lent a helping hand to the Administration: In the time of crisis, it's incumbent upon us as human beings to help each other whichever we can. NCC Cadets and NSS volunteers pitched up and helped the authorities /organizations in creating awareness among the general public about the pandemic.

Hosted Webinars -Recognising and Responding to Mental Health concerns in the Covid-ified world, the institution conducted and also guided students to attend webinars on mental health and wellbeing, to ensure that youth had an avenue to seek advice from professionals and ask questions about coping with COVID-19's impact on mental health.

Adoption of hybrid learning approach in the post-pandemic phase- University Grants Commission -a statutory body set up by the Government of India charged with coordination, and maintenance of standards of higher education- has issued guidelines; wherein it should be ensured that not more than 50% of the total students should be present at any point of time. Hence, a mix of face-to-face and online teaching a "blended learning" approach has been adopted by the institution. Many students admitted in the institution are not from Bengaluru and belong to the other Indian States, keeping the outstation students in mind during online classes additional assistance is provided in academics to such students as and when required.

4. Agents of Change

4.1 National Cadet Corps [NCC]

DSBA NCC cadets formed part of Ex-Yogdaan and has been incrementally working shoulder to shoulder with civil and police personnel in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic since May 2020.



Under the aegis of 2 Kar Bn NCC and Group HQ'A' Bengaluru DSBA, NCC Cadets formed part of Ex-Yogdaan and participated in the Grocery Kits and Mask Distribution Programme at Tathaguni, Kanakapura Road.

110 grocery kits containing the essentials were distributed to the old, poor, needy daily wage earners and migrant workers from different parts of the country directly affected by the aftermath of COVID-19. This noble initiative was carried out by the NCC with the support of Kaggalipura Police and the selected village authorities.



Further, initiatives were taken by SGT Chirag Shetty K, SGT Chethan C, CPL Kruthika R and LCPL Aniruddh G Rao to create public awareness about COVD-19, SGT Keerthana R and SGT Pooja V Jain provided information on the steps and use of Aarogya Setu App developed by the Govt. of India and SGT Aruna J also provided inputs on how the pandemic spreads and how to protect oneself.




