UD's President Dr. Eesa Bastaki

University of Dubai (UD) has completed eight years as a signatory of Principals for Responsible Management (PRME) 2016. During this period we have been focusing on different ways of implementing the six principles. Currently UD is actively participating in the antipoverty interest group of PRME. In order to address UD's activities concerning PRME, this report contains the major events related to the six principles that took place during the past two years. During this period, UD initiated several activities such as international day, visits to cancer center, clean up campaigns, world water conservation

day, and earth hours. UD hosted 20 guest speakers from different industries who lectured on their activities related to corporate social responsibility (CSR), business ethics and initiatives on sustainable business. UD's partnership with ENGAGE Dubai, an employee volunteering organization, has been continuing since past several years. In the past two years, we have been focusing on implementing first two, forth, fifth and sixth principles.

President, Dr. Eesa Mohammed Bastaki, has been taking leadership in implementing PRME in UD. Dr. Bastaki was one of the panelists in the PRME MENA conference held in Morocco on 11 November 2014. Provost, Dr. Geoffrey Gachino, is rendering all support for PRME activities at the UD. Dr. Ibrahim Tabche, Dean of the College of Business Administration, supervises the activities. In addition, Dr. Eappen Thiruvattal coordinates PRME activities along with the committee members Dr. Yaprak Anadol and Mrs. Marina Arnaut at the university level. The core values of UD, *Ethical behavior in all aspects of life, sound citizenship through personal, social and environmental responsibility, and continuous improvement in teaching, learning and research* reflect the commitment of UD towards PRME.



Principle 2 | Values: We will incorporate into our academic activities and curricula the values of global social responsibility as portrayed in international initiatives such as the United Nations Global Compact.

During the awareness campaign conducted at the beginning every semester, faculty members explain PRME's role in UD's strategic actions to students. In addition, posters displaying the six principles are displayed in key locations around campus. The following are the highlights of activities based on Principle 2:

i) New Course in Sustainability

An elective course GSUS 200, Sustainability was prepared and launched in spring 2014 by PRME coordinator, Dr. Eappen Thiruvattal. Textbook/workbook, adapted for the course is 'The Sustainable Business: A Practitioners' Guide to Achieving Long-Term Profitability and Competitiveness' authored by Jonathan Scott. Anti-corruption toolkit from PRME website was introduced in the course. Students of the course, conducted a group project on sustainability. Each group of students studied the sustainability initiatives of a corporation operating in the UAE and submitted reports worth 30% of their final grade. In addition, they made a presentation worth 10%. Case studies relating to social and environmental, corporate social responsibility and sustainability are used in the courses of College of Business Administration. Faculties were

encouraged to teach these topics covered in their textbooks with great importance.

Business and Society is a mandatory course for all students who have completed 60 credit hours of study. This course puts great emphasis on case studies relating to environmental issues, corporate social responsibility and ethics. In addition, the materials covered in this course include PRME activities and the methods by which UD implements them. Guest speakers from the industry and Government are also a special feature of the Business and

Society class. They bring in real life cases to the class.

ii) Translation of Sustainability Textbook into Arabic

As part of the commitment to Principle 2 of PRME, UD translated the textbook/workbook, *The Sustainable Business: A Practitioners' Guide to Achieving Long-Term Profitability and Competitiveness* authored by Jonathan Scott into Arabic. This version is posted on the web page of GRLI, which can be accessed and downloaded free of charge by universities for academic purposes. The Arabic version of the book/workbook can be a useful tool for teaching Sustainability courses in Middle Eastern universities that deliver courses in Arabic language. Hard copies of the book are available for purchase from University of Dubai for a nominal price.



Principle 1 | Purpose: We will develop the capabilities of students to be future generators of sustainable value for business and society at large and to work for an inclusive and sustainable global economy.

UD organized the following events under this principle:

i) Job Fair 2016

Principle 4 | Research: We will engage in conceptual and empirical research that advances our understanding about the role, dynamics, and impact of corporations in the creation of sustainable social, environmental and economic value.

Principle 5 | Partnership: We will interact with managers of business corporations to extend our knowledge of their challenges in meeting social and environmental responsibilities and to explore jointly effective approaches to meeting these challenges.

In partnership with international and national stakeholders UD has been involved in activities benefitting the environment and society. The following section describes these activities:

i) The World Water Day

In celebration of the World Water Day, the Environmental Club at UD organized two activities on

iii) Cultural exchange program

In spring 2015, a group of Chinese teachers from Ningxia University completed an Arabic language and Culture program provided by the Center of the Executive Development at UD. iv) Employee volunteering

UD is an active member and partner of ENGAGE Dubai, an employee volunteering organization with more than fifty member companies. This is an initiative of the Dubai Chamber. As a partner of ENGAGE, UD has brought 20 executives as guest speakers from participating organizations to lecture to students during the past 24 months. Faculty members of UD also participated in different employee volunteering activities organized by ENGAGE.

v) Guest speakers on SCSR and sustainability

On a regular basis, UD hosts executives from the industry as guest speakers on topics such as corporate social responsibility, environmental problems, and sustainability. In the past two years we have hosted 20 guests from organizations including the Standard Chartered Bank, Gulf Craft, General Electric, Apparel Group, DU telecommunications, and Dubai Chamber.

vi) Clean up campaign 2014

UD Students participated in 'Clean up the World' campaign on 12 November 2014. The week-long clean-up campaign was organized by Dubai Municipality in partnership with the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP). Every year the event engages an estimated 35 million volunteers in 130 countries, making it one of the largest community based

UD's coordinator of PRME, Dr. Eappen Thiruvattal, attended the PRME affinity group meeting of Annual Accreditation conference of AACSB at Amsterdam, Netherlands on 24 May 2015. Dr. Thiruvattal presented to an audience of delegates from several universities, the different methods by which PRME was successfully implemented in the UD in different stages, leading to the 3rd PRME MENA regional conference in Dubai. The interactive session encouraged several delegates to be part of the global community of PRME and implement its principles in their institutions.

ii) Workshop at PRME MENA conference- Cairo

UD's delegate Dr. Yaprak Anadol attended PRME MENA Conference in Cairo, Egypt in April 2016. Dr. Anadol co-facilitated the Anti-corruption workshop and shared the experience of University of Dubai in implementing anti-corruption tool kit in the classroom environment. The PRME conference enabled all the participants to share personal and institutional experiences which lead to produce new ideas and constructive suggestions on the implementation of the SDGs through the framework in the MENA Region.

iii) Seminar on Corporate Social Responsibility

UD organized a Seminar titled "Dubai and Corporate Social Responsibility" on 18 November 2014. Dr. Harold Koster, the Dean of UD Law School, presented the topic to an audience of entrepreneurs, executives and CEOs.
